

Museum Activities Day

Children enjoyed trying their hands at Roman skills at a half-term activity day organised by the volunteers at Ilchester Heritage Centre (new name of

the museum). Making mosaics was one choice on offer at the Town Hall. Another was making a "bulla" the little pouch that held a lucky charm that Roman children would wear round their necks throughout their childhood. We were lucky to be given some beautiful soft suede leather for this project by Owen Barry, which makes sheepskin, leather and cowhide products at Street. Gerry Masters used one piece for an apron when he demonstrated the skill of a medieval monyer, the man who literally "struck" the coins at a mint. There were dozens of mints in towns



across the country in medieval times, including Ilchester. Two "dies" are needed to make a coin, one for each face of the coin. Each is a metal cylin-



der with an inverted image of one of the faces on it. One of the dies was fixed upright in a block of wood, then a circular blank of metal was placed on top of it and the monyer struck the remaining die down onto the blank with a hammer. The force rammed the images from the dies into either side of the blank. The museum's dies for medieval coin-making were created some years ago by the late Roy Scutchings.
